Before you leave...



Learn on weather conditions along the way and at your destination



Check your home's security and safety. Shut off power, water, and gas mains



Place important documents in a safe location



Inform family members or friends on the address and telephone number where you can be reached



Make sure everybody has his/her ID and blood type information



Make sure your vehicle has good working conditions. Carry a tools kit and fire extinguisher



If you are leaving the country, register at Secretaría de Relaciones Exteriores (SRE) = Foreign Affairs Secretariat's web page and follow the Traveler's Guidelines



During the trip...



If you are driving, follow traffic regulations. Be very careful along landslide and flooding areas, and consider visibility conditions



If you are traveling with children and seniors, foresee their requirements, and don't lose track of them



If you find rain, be extremely careful and don't cross rivers or fords



Plan an alternate route, in case of blockage

At your destination...



If you visit rivers, coast or inland resorts, and lagoons, obey civil protection indications; identify medical services, and have emergency phones at hand



If you visit the Pacific beaches and feel a strong earthquake, immediately move to high areas because there may be the possibility of a tsunami



If you are exposed to direct sunlight, use sun screen, hat and dark eyeglasses



If you are camping, do so in safe areas and avoid risky locations



Obey instructions by civil protection authorities



If you visit crowded areas, take special care of children and seniors



Use cleanliness to avoid infections



If you stay in a hotel, check their evacuation routes and security zones
