• Fumaroles and sporadic seismic activity.

The Popocatepetl is one of the most studied and monitored volcanoes worldwide.

Within a radius of less than 100 km from the crater. 25 million people live.

Remain aware and get ready for a possible evacuation.

Phase 1 Manifestation of activity




 Sporadic and light ash emissions.

Phase 2 Increased activity



- Possibility of pyroclastic flows from explosions.
- Mudflows and debris within short range.

Phase 3 Intermediate to high activity



- Persistence of fumaroles, gas and light ashfall in nearby areas.
- Explosions of increasing intensity wich launch incandescent fragments.
- Possible pyroclastic flows midrange.

Imminent danger. You and your family have to be ready for evacuation.

Phase 1 Explosive activity of intermediate to high risk



- slopes of the vocano.
- Important ashfall in distant towns and cities.
- Pyroclastic flows and mudflows that can réach nearby towns.

Phase 2 Explosive activity of high to extreme risk

- Eruption columns of long range.
- Heavy ashfall, sand and volcanic fragments at greater distances.
- Possible partial collapse of the volcano.
- Pyroclastic flows and debris flows reaching near and intermediate populations.
- Great devastating lahars.
- Serious damage to the environment and areas marked on the volcanic hazards map.
